While the actual burning of LNG is cleaner than the burning of coal, when the environmental impact of the entire system is analyzed - from ground to pipe to furnace - it has been shown that the leaks that occur over miles of delivery that LNG is no cleaner than coal. That fact, combined with the massive destruction to public and private lands, demonstrate that fracking is not the answer to the planet's energy problems.

We can do better.
