Dear Ernest Moniz,

While I applaud the Department of Energy's proposal to end the practice of conditionally approving liquefied natural gas (LNG) export applications, much more is needed to understand the impacts of allowing LNG exports and to protect communities from the dangers of increased fracking to meet foreign demand.
