

- Created as EU FP6 Network of Excellence in 2004, Became a not for profit Association under French law in 2008
- Now has Pan European coverage; comprises 30 research institutes from 21 countries
- ✓ Draws together over 300 researchers with the multidisciplinary expertise needed to address all aspects of CO₂ storage




Sotacarbo Fault Lab - planned wells





- Permits for drilling and CO₂
 injection already in place
- Drilling of vertical monitoring well completed in October 2019 (well has optic fibre and Electrical Resistivity Tomography ERT)
- Next geophysical logs and drilling of injection well with fibreglass casing with the ERT and fibre optic cables soon

Act now for zero emissions: the role for CCUS key messages from 2019 Open Forum



- Society reasonably demands a just transition to a low-emission future
- Everyone citizens, politicians, industry has a shared responsibility towards climate sustainability
- The cost for mitigating climate change will be dramatically higher without CCS. Implementing large scale CCS is a challenge, but more dramatic changes to large scale infrastructure have been made in the past
- Clear, consistent and long-term policy and regulatory measures are needed to provide a predictable business landscape that will attract investment
- CCS is an opportunity for economic growth and job creation
- Establishing and maintaining a dialogue on CCS is essential, both in terms
 of international actions to drive CCUS forward, but also on a local level

2019 Open Forum workshops - highlights



CO₂ storage stories; learning by doing (CO₂GeoNet-CSLF workshop)

- Topics: seismicity, injectivity and monitoring CO2 storage sites.
- Experience from projects in US, Canada, Norway, Japan, Iceland and Algeria were presented
- Highlighted the value of sharing lessons learned, not just on science, but on practical aspects

Towards commercialisation; insights from US and Norway (CLIMIT and ARI)

- facilitated knowledge sharing on establishing industrial-scale CCS worldwide
 - Successful business cases and experience from US (EOR)
 - Northern Lights project key issues from storage operators

11th World Conference of Scientific Journalists



- Lausanne, 1 5 July 2019
- Joint CO₂GeoNet ENOS activity recognise importance of engaging with civil society and media
- Objective of booth was to interest journalists in CCS
- Organised 'coffee and cake' event attended by around 100 journalists
 - Half of the attendees signed up for the ENOS and CO₂GeoNet newsletters hope this is a sign they want to know more about CCS!

<u>Pathways to a sustainable future; governance of CO2 removal & mitigation strategies for industry</u> - in collaboration with Carnegie Climate Governance Initiative and ImplementaSur – was confirmed for 11th December in EC Pavilion but now waiting for update after confirmation of new venue

Proposed actions at COP:

- **Booth:** We need CO₂ capture and storage (CCS & CCUS) to meet the Paris Agreement targets
- Side event: Meeting the climate sustainability challenge with ready-to-go technologies
- Joint press release with national CO₂ Clubs (a follow-up action from Open Forum workshop)
