CSLF Event Endorsement Guidelines

- Event organizers must demonstrate:
 - Event organized by public and/or private entities from at least one CSI F Member country
 - Event is consistent with goals and purposes of CSLF
- Event Sponsors must agree to:
 - Allow CSLF to post link to the event
 - Use CSLF logo
 - Send an invitation
 - Provide one free registration
 - Provide presentation opportunity



CSLF Event Endorsement Guidelines

The Curbon Sequestration Leadership Forum (CSLF) was formed in time 2003 to facilitate the development of improved, cost-effective carbon capture and storage (CCS) technologies; to make these technologies broadly available internationally; and to identif and address wider issues relating to carbon capture and storage. The current members of CSLF are Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, Colombia, Denmark, European Commission many, Greece, India, Italy, Japan, Korea, Mexico, Netherlands, New Zealan axia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, United Kingdom, and the United States.


Events wishing to be considered for CSLF endorsement as a CSLF co-sponsored even are asked to submit their normantions utilizing the Event Recognition form (see Attachment I) to the CSLF Secretariat. The Secretariat serves as the principal coordinator of the CSLF's communications and activities. The Secretariat will e he nominations based upon the criteria and qualifications set forth in this document

 (to be available on CSLF website)
- Event organizers must sign CSLF
 Event Recognition Agreement
 (upon approval)



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CSLF Web Linking Policy

- Hyperlinks to a website are only allowed if website is:
 - Sponsored, supported, or partnered by the CSLF;
 - Educational in nature; or
 - Government website, including those sites sponsored by state or local governments
- Links must support the Forum's mission
- Links that exhibit hate, bias, political affiliation, or discrimination are prohibited
- No product endorsement allowed



CSLF Web Linking Policy

Links from CSLI

The ability to hyperlink to sources external to the Forum is a fundamental part of the World Wide Web, and can add significant value to the functionality of the publicly accessible CSLF website.

Hyperlinks to a website are only allowed if the website is sponsored, supported, or partnered by the CSLF, is educational in nature, or is a Government website, including those sites sponsored by state or local governments.

The CSLF will not allow any hyperlinks to any website that exhibits hate, bias, or discrimination, or which contains information or hyperlinks belonging to or supporting political affiliation.

Links to non-CSLF web resources must support the Forum's mission. In determining whether to allow access to a hyperlink, the CSLF considers the following factors:


- Is the recommended website an official government-owned or supported website?
 Does the recommended website provide official government information or appropriate.
- Does the recommended website complement existing information or

- 5. Is the recommended website's content relevant, useful and authoritative
- Does the recommended website's information appear to be accurate.
- sternal links should be reviewed every six months to ensure their continued suitabilit

External links should be reviewed every six months to ensure their continued suitabile if the content of a linked external site becomes questionable or objectionable, the CSL will remove the link.

Furthermore, no product endorsements or preferential treatment must be given on the CSIF website. No payment of any kind must be accepted in exchange for a lisk placed on the CSLF website. The CSLF website must not require or encourage users to choose any specific browser software; and graphics or logos depicting companies/products must not appear on the site.

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CSLF Web Linking Policy



- Link contains inaccurate or misleading information or has changed such that it is no longer in compliance;
- Access becomes difficult due to non-standard formatting, lengthy download times or intrusive advertising; or
- Link is permanently unreachable or remains unavailable for a lengthy period.

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
Message Development for CCS

- Extensive literature review shows public concerned about:
 - Why CCS? (instead of renewables, conservation)
 - Safety of CCS (will it cause earthquakes, explosions, H₂O contamination?)
 - Cost
 - Scale (who is storing what, where, and how much is needed?)
 - Liability (who pays if leak occurs now, or 300 years from now?)



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Message Development for CCS



- 1-2 pages each; written for a general audience
- Promote positive CCS messages
- Topics to include:
 - Why CCS?
 - Capturing CO2
 - Storing CO2 Underground
 - Transporting CO2
 - Health & Safety Matters
 - Legal/Regulatory Matters
 - Financial Matters
