# Themes Two Major Themes of This Report



### Congratulations!

- •CSLF mission is important
- Has the potential to do tremendous good



### Wake-Up Call!

- Stakeholder engagement is barely meaningful and inadequate on multiple levels
- Grave concern that CSLF is not gaining adequate momentum.

## **Congratulations!**



- Dedication of CSLF meeting organizers and CSLF secretariat staff is clear. Their passion is evident. Their effort is immensely appreciated.
- ► A lot has been achieved, but let's be humble. We're just starting.

## Wake-Up Call! that includes stakeholders



- CSLF is important and requires resources.
  - There is grave concern that CSLF is not gaining adequate momentum
- CSLF is one among several complementary forums to address climate change.
- ► There is an agreement that there is a need for a policy commitment to deep cuts in CO₂ and that policy is a key driver in CCS deployment. There is a consensus that CSLF is not a substitute for Kyoto discussions and post-Kyoto discussions. This position must be broadly communicated.
- Concerns that need to be resolved before CCS adoption.
  - What are the technical conditions that must be met?
  - What are the regulations for storage?
  - What is role of CCS in a broader energy system?
  - How do we address technology transfer?

## Recommendations from Stakeholders

#### **Forum**

- Build robust business plan.
  - Goal
  - Strategy
  - Actions
  - Timing of Actions
  - Role and responsibilities
- Create a steering committee (e.g., IPHE model).
- Issue a "re-positioning statement" at COP to clearly communicate CSLF goals and clarify CCS is not a replacement for Kyoto
- Develop a more robust, international public outreach strategy.

## Recommendations from Stakeholders

#### **Forum**

- Explore CCS deployment incentives.
- Open all documents/websites to stakeholder review in a timely manner.
- Engage other organizations that are working on the world's response to climate change (e.g., COPs, IPHE).
- Engage the developing countries, in a major way:
  - Stimulate in-country engagement
  - New CSLF projects. Stakeholders can help (e.g., WEC).
- Fund what CSLF chooses to do adequately. (Right now it's not.)
- Proceed with great urgency, coupled best practices in risk assessment and management, to develop and deploy CCS.

## Recommendations from Stakeholders

### Meetings

- Stakeholder engagement in "all" sessions. Nothing closed. Need the ability for CSLF stakeholders to communicate directly with CSLF members.
- Stakeholder involvement on steering committee.
- Include a true cross-section of stakeholders.

### **Projects**

- All CSLF projects <u>must</u> have stakeholder engagement plans/budgets.
- Local and regional engagement prerequisite.
