Responses were received from 17 projects

Survey results - general

Majority support focused, topic-specific workshops

 Enables delegates and stakeholders to share learnings from CSLF-recognized projects

Workshops should allow:

- Time for in-depth discussion of presentations
- Outcomes and discussions to be summarized available to all CSLF members

Survey results - specific

Topics should be determined by members

- Lessons learned from storage exploration
- Saline aquifer projects
- Monitoring and verification techniques
- Environmental issues associated with amine emissions

Sharing of learnings

- Knowledge should be distributed within CSLF projects to all members
- Workshops provide best platform for exchange of information

Models include the Gordon Research Conferences and the American Association of Petroleum Geologists (AAPG) Hedberg Conferences.



Issues associated with CCS workshops
