




EXPANDING INSTUTITE MEMBERSHIP

263 Members as of September 2010




 More than 80% of global GHGs are captured through the Institute's membership, which includes United States and China.

STRATEGIC ANALYSIS CCS PROJECTS WORLDWIDE



- Over 85% of identified projects in early stages









GLOBAL REPRESENTATION OF PROJECTS







INSTITUTE PROJECT SUPPORT PROCESS

- Main mechanism by application first round proposals in January 2010
- Over 50 proposals in first application round totalling over \$500 million
- Participation by the majority of Global CCS Institute industry Members
- Applications evaluated by Institute and Parsons Brinkerhof consortium
- First supported projects selected for negotiation in May 2010
- First supported projects announcements in October 2010
- Focus on key challenges and collaboration between projects

THEMATIC GROUPS CONCEPT AND OPERATION

Purpose:

- Connect Members to learning from supported projects
- Connect projects globally
- Strengthen and connect networks globally
- Engage Members in directing Institute funding

Function and operation of each theme:

- Small working group to recommend tasks and run network
- Larger network for collaboration and knowledge sharing
- Member nominated Chair, Institute affiliated Co-Chair
- Institute funding for approved tasks, and meeting venues
- Institute provides digital knowledge sharing platform
- Operating in alignment with allied networks



- CO2 Storage and Groundwater Resource Management, in collaboration with IEAGHG


