- Capacity Building Fund established at the CSLF Ministerial in London, 2009
- Contributions committed: total USD 2.965.143
- Donors: Australia, Canada, the UK and Norway
- Focus: Emerging economy CSLF Members
- USD 1.984.409 has been committed
- 13 Capacity building projects in 4 countries



Brazil – 4 projects

- Total allocation USD 686.450
 - Training program: Mineral coal combustion and gasification process
 - Training program: CCS in the offshore environment
 - Knowledge base: Environmental impact assessment and Co₂ monitoring technologies
 - Workshop on Co₂ storage in the COMopportunities in Portuguese language countries



China – 5 projects

- Total allocation USD 712.000
 - Website on CCUS Technologies
 - Workshops on experience sharing and on legal/ regulatory aspects
 - Roadmap on CCUS financing

South Africa – 2 projects

- Total allocation USD 166.000
 - Workshops
 - Study on impacts of CCS on national priorities beyond climate changes



Mexico – 2 projects

- Total allocation USD 144.959
 - Introducing CCS into academic programs
 - Internship on CCS
 (USD 32.541 has been ring fenced for potential additional internship)

India
