


- Recommendation 1: Reduce the financial gap
 - Advance policies that address the financial gap and risk associated with early mover CCS demonstration and deployment.
- Recommendation 2: Funding support in developing countries
 - Identify and advance appropriate funding mechanisms to support the demonstration of large-scale CCS projects in developing economies.






- Recommendation 3: Develop legal and regulatory frameworks
 - Advance the development of legal and regulatory frameworks for CCS demonstration and deployment.
- Recommendation 4: Acknowledge the importance of marine treaty amendments
 - Promote the importance to global CCS deployment of ratifying key international marine treaty amendments.






- Recommendation 5: Share Knowledge
 - Support and encourage the development of best practice knowledge sharing from early mover projects, in particular those with public funding.
- Recommendation 6: Investigate carbon dioxide (C0₂) storage
 - Review key gaps in storage data coverage and knowledge, and progress storage exploration and capacity assessment.





- Recommendation 7: Support CCS in industry
 - Recognise the potential for CCS for industrial emission sources and review demonstration opportunities.
- Recommendation 8: Report on Progress
 - Request the CCUS Action Group to support the delivery of these recommendations and report on progress.
