The Government remains absolutely committed to CCS with a long term vision for wide-spread deployment of a cost-competitive CCS. That vision includes tens of GWs of installed capacity in the power sector and CCS on a variety of industrial applications, including the potential for clusters of power and industrial plants linked together by a pipeline network to transport CO₂ to suitable storage sites offshore.



The UK Government's Department for Energy and Climate Change (DECC), <http://www.decc.gov.uk/>, through its Office of Carbon Capture and Storage (OCCS), is tasked with facilitating the delivery of CCS in the UK and helping to promote its rapid deployment globally. On 3rd April 2012, DECC published its CCS Roadmap and launched a new CCS competition. The programme set out in the Roadmap includes:

- The CCS Commercialisation Programme – the new competition – with £1bn in upfront capital funding and additional support during the operational period, subject to affordability, available through 'Contracts for Difference' as proposed in our Electricity Market Reform (EMR) programme.
