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ORDER TERMINATING LONG-TERM AUTHORIZATION  
TO IMPORT NATURAL GAS FROM CANADA

DOE/FE ORDER NO. 387-A

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Pacific Gas Transmission Company (PGT) is authorized to import near Kingsgate, British Columbia, up to 1,023 Mcf per day of natural gas from Canada through October 31, 2005, pursuant to DOE Opinion and Order No. 63-A (ERA Docket No. 82-16-NG),1/  
- issued April 2, 1985, as amended by DOE/FE Opinion and Order No. 387 (FE Docket No. 89-62-NG),2/ issued March 6, 1990. Until  
- November 1, 1993, this gas was transported to the California border by PGT's pipeline and sold to Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E). The Department of Energy (DOE) granted the authorization based on the terms of PGT's gas sales contract with Alberta and Southern Gas Company, Ltd. (A&S) dated January 31, 1961, as amended.

On April 14, 1994, PGT filed an application with DOE's Office of Fossil Energy to terminate DOE/FE Opinion and Order No. 387 (Order 387). The contract between PGT and A&S was terminated

by the parties effective November 1, 1993, and PGT is no longer selling gas to PG&E under the authorization. Rather, PG&E will purchase gas directly from Canadian producers under its own separate authorization.

Since the international contract upon which PGT's long-term gas supply arrangement was based has been terminated, there is no longer any need for the import authorization. Accordingly, pursuant to section 3 of the Natural Gas Act, Order 387 is hereby terminated.
