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ORDER AMENDING BLANKET IMPORT AND EXPORT AUTHORITY

DOE/FE ORDER NO. 1536-A

On October 28, 1999, the Office of Fossil Energy (FE) of the Department of Energy (DOE) granted PanCanadian Energy Services, Inc. (PanCanadian) short-term blanket authority, under DOE/FE Order No. 1536 (Order 1536), to import and export up to a combined total of 250 Bcf of natural gas from and to Canada through October 31, 2001.^{1/} On April 4, 2000, PanCanadian filed an application seeking to amend its current authority by: (1) increasing the aggregate volume to 500 Bcf for the remaining term of the authorization; (2) including imports of liquefied natural gas (LNG) from any international source; and (3) allowing it to import and export natural gas from and to Mexico.

Accordingly, pursuant to section 3 of the Natural Gas Act,^{2/} Order 1536 is hereby amended to authorize PanCanadian to import and export up to a combined total of 500 Bcf of natural gas from and to Mexico and Canada, and import LNG from any international source, over the remainder of its two-year term which expires on October 31, 2001. With respect to the

reports PanCanadian files each calendar quarter, they must now include the following additional information if LNG imports take place: (1) the total volume of imports in Mcf and MMBtu; (2) the country of origin; (3) the name(s) of the sellers; (4) the name(s) of the LNG tankers used; and (5) the average landed cost per MMBtu at the point of import. All other terms and conditions of Order 1536 remain in full force and effect.
