ORDER GRANTING BLANKET AUTHORIZATION
TO IMPORT AND EXPORT NATURAL GAS,
FROM AND TO CANADA AND
TO IMPORT LIQUEFIED NATURAL GAS FROM
OTHER INTERNATIONAL SOURCES

I. DESCRIPTION OF REQUEST

On November 18, 2004, Engage Energy Canada, L.P. (Engage Energy) filed an application with the Office of Fossil Energy of the Department of Energy (DOE), under section 3 of the Natural Gas Act (NGA),^{1/} for blanket authorization to import and export up to a combined total of 1000 billion cubic feet of natural gas from and to Canada, and to import liquefied natural gas (LNG) from other international sources. The applicant requests the authorization be granted for a two-year term beginning January 1, 2005. Engage Energy is an Alberta corporation with its principal place of business in Calgary, Alberta.

II. FINDING

The application has been evaluated to determine if the proposed import and export arrangement meets the public interest requirement of section 3 of the NGA, as amended by section 201 of the Energy Policy Act of 1992 (Pub. L. 102-486). Under section 3(c), the import and export of natural gas from and to a nation with which there is in effect a free trade agreement requiring national treatment for trade in natural gas, and the import of LNG from other international sources, are deemed to be consistent with the public interest and must be granted without modification or delay. The authorization sought by Engage Energy to import and export natural gas from and to Canada, a nation with which a free trade agreement is in effect, and the import of LNG from other international sources, meets the section 3(c) criterion and, therefore, is consistent with the public interest so long as the LNG sources are not subject to trading sanctions. This Order authorizes transactions with terms of no longer than two years.

ORDER

Pursuant to section 3 of the Natural Gas Act, it is ordered that:

A. Engage Energy Canada, L.P. (Engage Energy) is authorized to import and export up to a combined total of 1000 billion cubic feet of natural gas, including liquefied natural gas (LNG) from and to Canada, and to import LNG from other international sources. The term of the authority will begin on January 1, 2005, and extend through December 31, 2006.

B. This natural gas may be imported and exported at any point on the border between the United States and Canada.

C. The LNG may be imported at any LNG receiving facility in the United States and its territories.

D. With respect to the imports and/or exports authorized by this Order, Engage Energy shall file with the Office of Natural Gas Regulatory Activities, within 30 days following each calendar quarter, reports indicating whether imports and/or exports of natural gas have been made. Quarterly reports must be filed whether or not initial deliveries have begun. If no imports and/or exports of natural gas have been made, a report of "no activity" for that calendar quarter must be filed. If imports and/or exports have occurred, the report must give the details of each transaction by country: (1) the total monthly volumes in thousand cubic feet (Mcf); (2) average purchase price of gas per million British thermal units (MMBtu) at the international border; (3) the name of the seller(s); (4) the name of the purchaser(s); (5) the estimated or actual duration of the agreement(s); (6) the name of the United States transporter(s); (7) the point(s) of entry and exit; (8) the geographic market(s) served (for imports, by State); (9) the name(s) of the LNG tankers or the number of tanker truck(s) used; (10) the average landed cost per MMBtu of LNG

at the point of import; and, if applicable, (11) the per unit (MMBtu) demand/commodity/reservation charge breakdown of the contract price. [OMB NO.: 1901-0294]

E. The first quarterly report required by this Order is due not later than April 30, 2005, and should cover the period from January 1, 2005, until the end of the first calendar quarter, March 31, 2006.

F. The quarterly reports required by this Order shall be filed with the U.S. Department of Energy, Office of Natural Gas Regulatory Activities, FE-34, P.O. Box 44375, Washington, D.C. 20026-4375.
