ORDER GRANTING BLANKET AUTHORIZATION TO
IMPORT NATURAL GAS FROM CANADA

DOE/FE ORDER NO. 1979

MAY 7, 2004

I. DESCRIPTION OF REQUEST

On April 30, 2004, Indeck-Oswego Limited Partnership (Indeck-Oswego) filed an application with the Office of Fossil Energy of the Department of Energy (DOE), under section 3 of the Natural Gas Act (NGA),^{1/} for blanket authorization to import up to 18 billion cubic feet of natural gas from Canada. Indeck-Oswego requests the authorization be granted for a two-year term beginning on May 16, 2004.^{2/} Indeck-Oswego is a Illinois limited partnership with its principal place of business in Buffalo Grove, Illinois.

II. FINDING

The application has been evaluated to determine if the proposed import arrangement meets the public interest requirement of section 3 of the NGA, as amended by section 201 of the Energy Policy Act of 1992 (Pub. L. 102-486). Under section 3(c), the import of natural gas from a nation with which there is in effect a free trade agreement requiring national treatment for trade in natural gas is deemed to be consistent with the public interest and must be granted without modification or delay. The authorization sought by Indeck-Oswego to import natural gas from Canada, a nation with which a free trade agreement is in effect, meets the section 3(c) criterion and, therefore, is consistent with the public interest. This Order authorizes transactions under contracts with terms of no longer than two years.

ORDER

Pursuant to section 3 of the Natural Gas Act, it is ordered that:

A. Indeck-Oswego is authorized to import up to 18 billion cubic feet of natural gas from Canada. The term of the authority will begin on May 16, 2004, and extend through May 15, 2006.

B. This natural gas may be imported at any entry point on the border of the United States and Canada.

C. With respect to the natural gas imports authorized by this Order, Indeck-Oswego shall file with the Office of Natural Gas & Petroleum Import & Export Activities, within 30 days following each calendar quarter, reports indicating whether imports of natural gas have been made. Quarterly reports must be filed whether or not initial deliveries have begun. If no imports of natural gas have been made, a report of "no activity" for that calendar quarter must be filed. If imports have occurred, the report must give details of each transaction, including: (1) the total monthly volumes in thousand cubic feet (Mcf); (2) the average purchase price of gas per million British thermal units (MMBtu) at the international border; (3) the name of the seller(s); (4) the name of the purchaser(s); (5) the estimated or actual duration of the agreement(s); (6) the name of the United States transporter(s); (7) the point(s) of entry; (8) the geographic market(s) served; and, if applicable, (9) the per unit (MMBtu) demand/commodity/reservation charge breakdown of the contract price. D. The first quarterly report required by this Order is due not later than July 30, 2004, and should cover the period from May 16, 2004, until the end of the second calendar quarter, June 30, 2004.

E. The quarterly reports shall be filed with the U.S. Department of Energy, Office of Natural Gas & Petroleum Import & Export Activities, FE-34, P.O. Box 44375, Washington, D.C. 20026-4375.
