ORDER VACATING LONG-TERM AUTHORIZATION  
TO IMPORT NATURAL GAS FROM CANADA

DOE/FE ORDER NO. 1182-A

On June 26, 1996, the Office of Fossil Energy (FE) of the Department of Energy (DOE) granted long-term authorization to North Canadian Marketing Corporation (NCM) in DOE/FE Order No.1182 (Order 1182) (1FE ¶71,279) to import from Canada to the United States up to 25,000 Mcf of natural gas per day, over a 20-year term beginning on July 1, 1996.

On March 11, 2009, CanNat Energy Inc. (CanNat) requested that DOE vacate North Canadian Marketing Corporation (NCM) Order 1182. In its request, CanNat explains that North Canadian Marketing Corporation (NCM) was sold to Union Pacific Resources, then sold to Anadarko Resources, and finally sold to Canadian Natural Resources Limited (CNRL). CanNat Energy Inc. (CanNat) is a wholly-owned subsidiary of CNRL. CanNat has its own blanket authorization to import and export

natural gas from and to Canada in Order No. 2469 (Order 2469) (2FE, ¶71,590) issued on February 26, 2008. Therefore, CanNat no longer needs the authorization granted in Order No. 1182.

Accordingly, pursuant to section 3 of the Natural Gas Act, the authorization to import natural gas from Canada granted to North Canadian Marketing Corporation (NCM) in Order 1182 is hereby vacated, effective the date of this Order.
