**MOTION TO INTERVENE OF
THE AMERICAN PETROLEUM INSTITUTE**

Pursuant to 10 C.F.R. 590.303, the American Petroleum Institute (“API”) files this motion to intervene in the above-captioned docket. In support, API states as follows.

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BACKGROUND

On March 23, 2012, Jordan Cove Energy Project, L.P. (“Jordan Cove”) filed an application with the Department of Energy’s Office of Fossil Energy (“DOE/FE”) seeking a long-term multi-contract authorization to export domestically produced liquefied natural gas (“LNG”) up to the equivalent of 292 billion cubic feet (“Bcf”) of natural gas per year over a 25-year term to non-Free Trade Agreement (“non-FTA”) countries. Jordan Cove seeks this authorization to export natural gas as LNG on its own behalf and as agent for others,

commencing on the earlier of the date of first export or seven years after authorization is granted. Jordan Cove proposes to liquefy the natural gas at the Jordan Cove LNG liquefaction facility proposed for in Coos County, Oregon, for export via ocean-going vessel to any nation that currently has or develops the capacity to import LNG, with which the United States does not have an FTA requiring national treatment for trade in natural gas, and with which trade is not prohibited by U.S. law or policy. On March 24, 2014, DOE/FE conditionally approved Jordan Cove's application to export LNG to non-FTA countries.¹

On October 5, 2015, Jordan Cove amended its application to increase the volume for which it seeks export authorization from DOE/FE from 292 Bcf of natural gas per year to up to 350 Bcf of natural gas per year. The deadline to intervene in the above-captioned proceeding is March 23, 2016.²

INTERVENTION

API is a national trade association representing more than 650 member companies involved in all aspects of the oil and natural gas industry in the United States. Our members include owners and operators of LNG import and export facilities in the United States and around the world, as well as owners and operators of LNG vessels, global LNG traders, and manufacturers of essential technology and equipment used all along the LNG value chain. Our members also have extensive experience with the drilling and completion techniques used in shale gas development and in producing America's natural gas resources in a safe and environmentally responsible manner. API thus has a direct and immediate interest in this docket
