The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) has completed our review of the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) for the ELBA III Project (FERC/EIS-0207F) issued in August 2007. We submit the following comments under provisions of the Endangered Species Act (Act) of 1973, as amended; (16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.). This correspondence addresses only those federally-listed species in Georgia under the jurisdiction of the Service. The project includes the Elba Terminal Expansion and the Elba Express Pipeline under Southern LNG Inc., Docket No. CP06-470 000 and Elba Express

Company, LLC, Docket No.CP06-471-000.

In an August 10, 2007 correspondence, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) determined that the ELBA III Project is not likely to adversely affect West Indian manatees, wood storks, American alligators, eastern indigo snakes, flatwoods salamanders, Canby's dropwort, pool sprite, and pondberry. Based on information gathered from the FEIS and our meetings and communications with representatives from the FERC, the Georgia Department of Natural Resources, Southern LNG, Inc, EL Paso Company, NOAA National Marine Fisheries Service, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, and ENSR Consulting, we concur with the FERC's determination.

However, obligations under section 7 must be reconsidered if: (1) new information reveals impacts of this identified action that may affect listed species or critical habitat in a manner not previously considered; (2) this action is subsequently modified in a manner

that was not considered in this review; (3) a new species is listed or critical habitat determined that may be affected by the identified action.
