Subject: Liquified Natural Gas Export Terminal Permit Request -- Please turn it down

Dear US Department of Energy:

As a resident in a state (PA) which is adversely affected by fracking of natural gas, I would urge you to turn down the permit requests you have to export LNG from 19 terminals that are currently import only.

In PA, at least, we were asked to bear the environmental damage because we were told the LNG would stay in the US and help us become energy independent. The current request to export the LNG shows that in PA, we were asked to make a sacrifice that doesn't exist – the LNG is going to the highest bidder and overseas, not to keep us energy-independent.

Please refuse these permits. If we're going to frack, we should at least be using the energy to keep the US energy-independent, not enriching the gas and oil companies that are fracking and paying almost nothing (at least in PA) to defray the environmental costs of the fracking.
