To Whom It May Concern:

The 2012 LNG Export Study concludes, "GDP also increases as a result of LNG exports. The most dramatic changes are in the short term, when investment in liquefaction capacity adds to export revenues and tolling charges to grow GDP." Additionally, an America's Natural Gas Alliance (ANGA) report on the economic impacts of shale gas estimates approximately 32,000 total jobs are supported throughout the economy for every 1 billion cubic feet per day of shale gas production.

LNG exports will not only drive additional production, but also support thousands of additional jobs in engineering, manufacturing, construction, and operation of the export infrastructure, as well as others indirectly along the equipment supply chain. These jobs will provide a much needed opportunity, especially for veterans who have served this great country.
